

CHAPTER IV

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

A. CONCLUSION

Based on research and data that has been obtained and processed in the previous chapter, namely Evaluation of Waste Bank Programs in Magelang District in 2017-2018, it can be concluded that:

1. Evaluation of the waste bank program in Magelang Regency in 2017-2018 has been going well but has not been optimal yet because there are still some obstacles such as equitable distribution of facility, social jealousy, lack of socialization from the Government, and lack of cooperation.

2. The following are the evaluation conclusions of each indicator:

a. Effectiveness: The Waste Bank Program in Magelang Regency has a good impact on the surrounding environment and can reduce the amount of waste in Magelang Regency. Especially in both regions, namely Muntilan and Dusun Cecelan.

b. Efficiency: This program can be said that it is still not efficient enough, because of the lack of aid funds obtained by the waste bank. However, the waste bank was able to develop with the small amount of funds obtained to run the program.

c. Adequacy: In Sekar Gendis Waste Bank the adequacy has been fulfilled quite well even though there are several criteria that have not been fulfilled. Whereas in Lestari Waste Bank is still fulfilled, there are 2

factors that influence this, namely, the distance and ability of the facilitator.

d. Alignment: The distribution of Waste Bank Program is still not optimal because more than 50% of the total regions that receive aid funds are still seeking assistance outside of the assistance of the Regional Government.

e. Responsiveness: The community towards the program provided by the Government, Regional Government towards the waste bank and the community towards the waste bank is running well.

f. Accuracy: The waste bank program has a very positive impact on the community and the results also meet the objectives of the waste bank program.

3. In evaluating the waste bank program there are factors that influence the implementation such as inhibiting factors, among others: distance from the administrative area, awareness of people who have not fully cared for the environment, and the distribution of programs that are not optimal because they are sometimes hampered in the Sub-district and not continued to villages.

4. The supporting factors are: the willingness of citizens to run the waste bank program, the appreciation shown by the government to the waste bank community in the form of prizes through creation contests, and the benefits felt by local residents with the existence of waste banks in their neighborhood. The implementation of the waste bank program is expected to overcome the waste problem which is one of the main problems in Magelang Regency, so that people can live more comfortable and have healthy life.

B. RECOMMENDATION

Firstly, it is recommended that the society continue to participate in the implementation of the waste bank program even though the support provided by the government has not fully been able to assist the implementation of waste bank in each village. The community must continue to be consistent with the programs that have been given and being implemented. The community that is part of the organization also continues to provide education about the importance of the environment for the next life to other communities as well as children which is the hope of the nation in the future.

Secondly, the Local Government continues to give their appreciation to the community in running the programs that are originating from the government. Appreciation is given not only when a creation contest is held but in whatever form can be done by the government so that the program continues. Furthermore, there must be a stronger collaboration between the Environmental Office and all Sub-districts in Magelang Regency so that the distribution of waste banks is more optimal. This will affect the distribution of socialization and training, as well as the facilities so there is no social jealousy. With clear distribution of waste banks from the Sub-district, the distribution of facilities related to facilities will be more easily distributed by the Environmental Office and other institutions. In addition, more information about the waste bank must be provided because besides making it easier for researchers to obtain the required data, the community will also find it easier to know and access the waste bank program.
